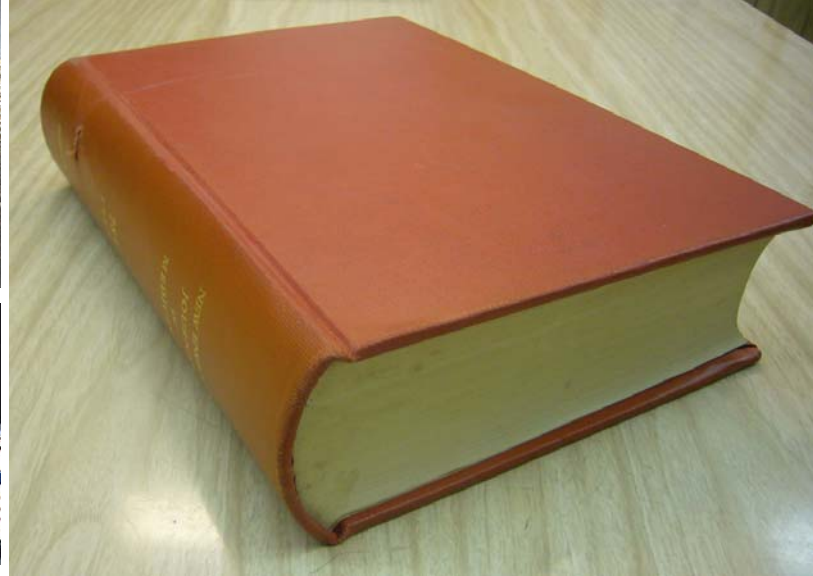
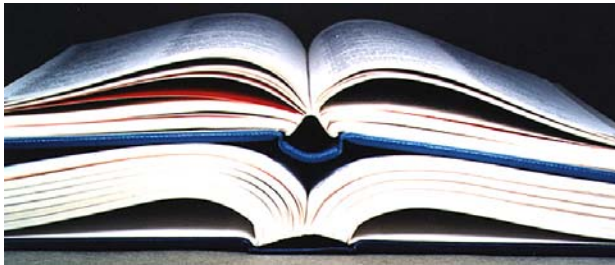


Oversewing is the process of building-up a book by sewing a section of individual sheets to it and the next two adjoining sections that provides a flexible strength unequalled by any other sewing process.

These two examples demonstrate the difference in opening characteristics between a book that has been oversewn (bottom) and a book that has been double fan adhesive bound (top). The oversewn book allows far less access into the gutter of the book, which will create difficulties when reading and photocopying the book and will most likely result in damage.
